#### Fourth crucial Climate Assessment Report released on 2 February 2007

Many of the WCRP climate experts contributed to the IPCC AR4 Working Group I report *Climate Change 2007: The Physical Science Basis,* released on 2 February (press release).

## Hot Climate Science in Cold Regions: New Study on Under-Ice Lakes in Antarctica

In a study published 16 February in *Science* WCRP/CliC scientist Dr Helen Fricker and colleagues observed sub-glacial lake discharges in Antarctica and discussed a possible sudden sea-level rise, an issue addressed by the WCRP Task Force on Sea-Level Rise (feature article).

#### Climate Change Assessment Strength from WCRP Multi-Model Archive and Analyses

WCRP's Working Group on Coupled Modelling initiated the world's first comprehensive collection and analyses of climate model projections, an effort underpinning IPCC AR4. The data base registered its 1000<sup>th</sup> user and provided input to over 200 scientific papers (press kit).

#### New Effort to Capture and Share the Benefit from Tropical Data

Jointly with THORPEX, a global atmospheric research programme, WCRP has initiated efforts to assemble as much tropical convection information as available using the new WMO Information System, WIS (www.clivar.org/data/convection/background.php).

#### Sea-Level Rise is on the Rise

The sea-level is rising faster than previously estimated. A new study published in *Science* suggests that past projections underestimated the extent of global sea-level rise (article).

## Cuts threaten Work on Climate Change in Great Britain and the States

Britain's world lead in climate change research is being put at risk by proposed government spending cuts (*The Independent* article). After having frozen the federal budget in the US, the National Science Foundation is barely able to fund one in five proposals (*Science* article).
